

# for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements

A voluntary, regional approach to state oversight of distance education

NC-SARA's Collection of **Enrollment Data** 

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February 14, 2017

On February 9, NC-SARA convened in Boulder a group of individuals to discuss the collection of enrollment data from SARA institutions. This article shares information about that meeting and next steps for NC-SARA's enrollment data collection. I've organized it around the meeting's agenda. Topics included a report on the May, 2016 survey; the timing of future surveys; cell size limitations; experiential learning placements; potential consequences of poor institutional reporting; data definitions; and the advisability of collecting FTEs vs. 12-month headcounts.

### 867 institutions SHOULD have reported 846 DID report (21 didn't)

Summary of the May, 2016 Enrollment Data Collection:

306 reporting institutions reported "zero" enrollments in all states

## The reporting instructions for May 2016 directed institutions with fewer than

Discussion, Recommendations and NC-SARA responses:

ten students in a state to report enrollments in that state as "zero." NC-SARA gave that direction to respond to institutional concerns about possible FERPA violations. The cell size limitation clearly accounts for some legitimate underreporting of enrollments, but having 36 percent of institutions report zeros for all states is not explained by that direction. Other factors were clearly in play.
